Our Mission focus for November is HAPI—Haitian Artisans for Peace International. HAPI was founded in 2007 by Valerie Mossman-Celestin (of Grand Rapids) and Paul Prevost (former mayor of Mizak, Haiti). HAPI has recently changed its name to Haitian Assets for Peace International—to recognize the evolvement and growth as an organization.

Their focus is to transform Haiti through the empowerment and advocacy of women (50% of their staff are female), and to equip local leaders to promote the health, economic and social well-being of Mizakians.

HAPI has been selected and is being financially supported by the United Methodist Church Global Board of Ministries. To break the cycle of charity and dependency, HAPI works in primarily rural areas to assist the families in meeting their basic needs by organizing their artistic skill into a money-making enterprise.

Significant activities include:

-Artisan fairs

-Micro-business loans

-Clean water projects

-Solar energy program

- Basic health/dental/maternal care

- Children's art (and 4H) activities

-Education and English classes (children and adults)

- Raise goats which are given to families

They also provide distance learning at the "Computer Café", and have opened the area's 1st Vocational Center to provide skills training to youth to lift themselves and their families out of poverty.

Dear Friends in Christ,

It was with a heavy heart that I prayerfully made the decision to cancel in-church worship. We will still have in-church worship on Sunday, December 6 with Communion, and Thursday, December 24 at 7pm. Just to be clear, we will close the service with the lighting of candles and singing one verse of Silent Night at the very end of the service.

Worship will continue online. We will be able to have singing this way, and worship will be a bit longer in length. I long for the day when we are back to normal. After the recent rallies in Michigan and due to increased gatherings over the holidays, numbers are expected to spike. Immediate family members have tested positive, some asymptomatic, some hospitalized, and at least one has died. My mother's hospice caregiver has been exposed to COVID. We are awaiting news on whether she is positive or not, so it's possible Mother and I have been exposed.

Please stay safe. Please know we are in prayer for you. Please know you can contact me at anytime, and I will return your call as soon as possible. (269-274-9416.)



Charge Conference Minutes Sunday, October 18, 2020

Rev. Margie Crawford, our District Superintendent, called the charge conference meeting to order at 5:15 pm on Sunday, October 18, 2020. Members of Church Council were present at church and via zoom.

Peg Edvenson presented a motion, which Lee VanHorn seconded, to approve Marilyn Griffin as secretary to take minutes of the charge conference. <u>Approved.</u>

Pastor's Salary

Janet Coykendall, Chair of SPRC, presented the pastor's compensation for 2021 as follows:

Total compensation: \$50,385 Professional Expenses: \$3,000

Household Furnishings Allowance: \$20,000

Medical Reimbursement: \$2,000

Peg Edvenson motioned to approve this package. Sharon Gould seconded. There were no questions. Rev. Crawford reminded those present that this package will only be for approx. 6 months since Pastor Gini is retiring. A new package will be approved with a new pastor. Approved.

Lay Leadership Report

Rev. Gini Heller presented the Lay Leadership Report. Corrections noted are:

- 1. On page 4, the Missions team says Jeff Williams is a member. This should be Jeff Edwards.
- 2. On page 4, the Endowment Committee section states that the Trustee Chair does not have a vote. This is incorrect, as that person does have a vote. The only people without votes are the Finance Committee designee and the pastor.
- 3. On page 1, remove Tom Orsborn from the 2022 class of Members at Large of the Church Council.

Lee Van Horn motioned to accept the Lay Leadership Report with these 3 corrections. Peg Edvenson seconded. <u>Approved.</u>

Lee Van Horn motioned to fill any vacancies in the Lay Leadership Report via the Church Council. Linda VanHartesveldt seconded. <u>Approved.</u>

Membership Report

Brenda Haney presented the membership report. Due to Coronavirus, no names will be put on the "2nd year list" for 2020 and voted on to be removed from membership. We began the year with 162 members, added 3 by profession of faith, added 1 reinstated member, and removed 3 members who passed away this year; leaving a total of 163 members. Three baptisms were done.

Certified Lay Servants

Gini Heller lifted up the names of our Certified Lay Servants – Dave Gombert, Pam Gombert, Sharon Gould, Georgene Greene, and Tom Orsborn. Rev. Crawford thanked them all and acknowledged their important ministry. Brenda Haney motioned to accept all 5 people as Certified Lay Servants. Lee VanHorn seconded. <u>Approved.</u>

Ministry Shares

It was reported that 100% of the congregation's ministry shares have been paid to date. Rev. Crawford thanked the congregation for their faithfulness.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Gini thanked everyone at St. Paul's for their faithfulness and support of each other and her during the Coronavirus pandemic. She appreciates how we emotionally, spiritually and financially support each other and the church.

With no other new business to be presented, Peg Edvenson motioned to adjourn the charge conference. Linda VanHartesfeldt seconded. <u>Approved.</u>

Pastor Gini led the group in prayer.

The meeting adjourned at 5:45 pm.

Advent

"Happy New Year! Advent, the four weeks prior to Christmas, marks the beginning of the Christian calendar. How appropriate that the first season of the year commemorates the arrival of Jesus Christ as Emmanuel, God with us.

The earliest information about Advent tells us that marking the season began in the fourth century A.D. as a time of preparation for baptism. By the Middle Ages, the focus had moved to anticipating the Second Coming of Christ and the ultimate realization of the Kingdom of God. It has only been within the last 50 years that the emphasis has shifted more to commemorating the Nativity, Jesus' birth in Bethlehem.

Consequently, we see there are three perspectives associated with Advent. Frist, we remember arrival/birth of Jesus to be our Savior. Second, we personally recall the arrival of Jesus Christ into our hearts and lives. Third, we hope for a Second Coming of Jesus when peace will reign forever.

May your Advent celebration be a blessing to your heart and soul and the beginning of another year of living in God's presence."
