St. Paul's Church Council Meeting Summary May 18, 2021

Pastor Gini – 1) She was not at the meeting, but sent information on upcoming worship services. On June 6, Dick Witvoet will preach, since Pastor Gini will be at Annual Conference. June 13 is music Sunday. June 20 will be an annual conference report by Pastor Gini and Peg Edvenson. June 27 is Gini's last Sunday. Anyone wishing to read, sing or participate that day is asked to contact the pastor. Peg Cargill will preach on July 4. July 11 will be Pastor Bri's first Sunday. 2) Three by five index cards are being passed out for church members to write down their name, contact info, and something about themselves to help introduce people at St. Paul's to Pastor Bri. 3) Council is tabling discussion about mask wearing and singing in church until our next meeting. They hope to gather feedback from the congregation and Pastor Bri. The safety of some members who can't be vaccinated for medical reasons and young children are a concern.

Over the Wall – Books for Hamilton students are ready to go to the teachers. Labels were printed this year instead of church members signing the inside of each book.

Missions – Upcoming Hurting World offerings are: May – Church World Service (an UMCOR grant for border shelters), June – Street children in Cambodia, July – Red Bird Clinic and Health Center in KY, and August – Native American Youth Ministry.

SPRC – 1) Two boxes will be available for cards, notes, and gift cards. One for Pastor Gini's retirement and one for Pastor Bri's welcome. We will also put together a welcome basket of home-made gift items for Bri. These boxes will be available at church on May 30, and June 6 and 13.

2) Staff hours for Heather and Scott to be at church will be determined once the new pastor is here.

3) A decision about an organist will also be made once Pastor Bri is here.

4) A question was asked about a substitute for Fran Hesley (as pianist) in case she wants to take time off. That is SPRC's duty to find a sub.

Finance – Financial reports from January to April were distributed. Our current deficit of \$11,489.15 is very close to what was planned for this time of the year in the budget. The hope is that giving will increase in the summer and fall, as it usually does.

Trustees – 1) Painting at the parsonage is complete, with many thanks to all who helped. 2) Doors have been installed, back yard pruning completed, and internet set up at the parsonage. 3) Carpeting will be installed the week of May 24. 4) People to help clean the parsonage will be needed – probably the weekend after Memorial Day – around June 4 or 5. Talk to Glenn Gould if you want to help.

213 Task Force – They will be meeting in the near future.

Scouts – They will be holding a Court of Honor on Monday, May 24 at 6:30 pm on the lawn at church. Church members are invited to help celebrate the scout's and leader's accomplishments.

Nominating Committee - **1)** Pastor Gini Heller and Peg Edvenson have put together job descriptions for committee heads.

Miscellaneous – 1) Pastor Gini and Peg Edvenson will be attending Annual Conference virtually on June 3-6. 2) Pastor Bri has asked for favorite scriptures from leadership of the church. 3) Glenn Gould is looking at changing the church's email format. Nothing is decided at this point.

The next regular church council meeting will be Tuesday, June 15, 2021 at 7 pm.
