SEPTEMBER HURTING WORLD OFFERING

The Missions Committee has chosen "Operation Classroom – Liberia" as the recipient of our September Hurting World Offering. Operation Classroom is a non-profit organization that partners with the United Methodist Church in Liberia and Sierra Leone to improve secondary education. There is a desperate need to educate young men and women in fields where employment is a possibility – especially in agriculture, engine mechanics, and construction. With unemployment at over 50%, these are fields where immediate employment is a real possibility. Operation Classroom provides scholarships to allow students who would otherwise be unable to attend school to get an education. This equips them with the knowledge and skills they need to provide for themselves and their families, as well as provide ethical Christian leadership within their communities. In the Image—is hosting a tour for those interested at 10:00am and 3:00pm on September 23rd. They will explain their processes, needs and, how volunteers can help.




OTW - Over The Wall

St. Paul's Church Council Meeting Summary

August 17, 2021

Pastor Bri − 1) Church conference will be Thursday, November 11. SPRC will meet at 6:30 pm. Church council will meet at 7:15 pm for the church conference. Both meetings will be via Zoom. Paperwork for conference will be due Nov. 1. 2) She is researching and networking to get ideas for children's/adult/ inter-generational ministries. There are many ideas out there that she's sorting through. 3) Thank you for the prayers for their health after family camp. So far, all of their covid tests have been negative.

Worship – Pam White reported Worship Committee will meet after worship on Sunday, August 22. They will include discussions on congregational singing and communion.

Over the Wall – 1) In the Image is doing their shoe give-away for school children on August 16-19. St. Paul's has some people who will work from 5:30 to 8 pm on Thurs., Aug. 19. 2) We are collecting supplies for baskets for Hamilton teachers through Sunday, Sept. 5. Some supply lists asked for small paper clips, but it should have read small paper cups. A new list will be emailed to all. Some programs at Hamilton don't start until Sept. 20, so the baskets will be distributed close to that date.

Missions – 1) Hurting World offering for Sept. is for Operation Classroom – Liberia. 2) October's Hurting World Offering will go to support the Gideon Association for Bible distribution. We will have a speaker from the Gideon organization sometime in October. 3) November and December Hurting World will go to the Hamilton School families' Christmas gifts. 4) Total Hurting World Offerings collected so far in 2021 are \$7,560. In addition to that, \$680 in 2020 Christmas offerings were sent out in Jan., 2021.

SPRC – 1) Church conference is Thursday, November 11, 2021. 2) SPRC is working on getting an organist for St. Paul's. 3) SPRC has not talked about nursery staffing yet.

Finance – Lyndon Wood distributed financial reports. July was a bad month since donations dropped. It was also a 3-paycheck month for staff members, so expenses were higher. Our income is still better than was budgeted.

Trustees – 1) Trustees did not meet in August. 2) A question was raised about the status of air conditioning unit replacement. We have the funds to cover this expense. The project is in progress. 3) What about all the lights in the coat room? Glenn stated they were donated from the cathedral downtown. He's waiting on a quote from an electrician to improve sanctuary lighting, especially in the chancel area. 4) A question was raised about our audio equipment and the on-line Sunday service. Is it ok or do we need to improve it? After some discussion, it was decided that the Trustees need input from the congregation about this. We also need more church members trained to operate the sound equipment. If we make improvements, will it bring more people in the door?

213 Task Force – 1) Sharon Gould and Pastor Bri have discussed the history of the 213 Task Force and future make-up of the group, but Bri would like time to digest everything. Sharon will have a meeting with the remaining members of the 213 Task Force in the future. 2) Sharon knows of a couple, Bob and Laura Keeley, who are very involved with children's ministries. Laura will do 1 consultation at no cost. Sharon will look into this. 3) Children's sermons have resumed.

Scouts – Bishop Bard, Bishop of Michigan, has sent a letter asking United Methodist Churches in Michigan who charter (sponsor) any type of Boy Scout troop, asking them to end their charter relationship as of Dec. 31, 2021 due to uncertainties associated with the law suits against the Boy Scouts for child abuse and the Boy Scouts' resulting bankruptcy. He recommends that if any relationship is kept, churches may allow troops to meet in their buildings under a "Facilities Use Agreement." Some council members don't like abandoning Troop 200. How is liability associated with the scouts different from liability associated with having Sunday School or a youth group? Glenn will research this and see what additional costs there may be for a rider to the church's insurance policy to protect the church and those church members that work with scouts. He will discuss this with the Trustees at their Sept. 14 meeting. It can then be discussed further at the next church council meeting. If St. Paul's isn't going to charter Troop 200 after the end of the year, the troop leadership needs to know in the next month or so, in order to have time to find a new chartering organization.

Nominating Committee – This will start in the next month or so.

Miscellaneous – Face Masks – We're still using the guidelines established in July. At this time, masks are recommended, but not required.

Miscellaneous – Prayer Cards – Dorothy Lehmann asked if they can they be used? Yes. Ushers will collect them and give them to Bri. It is hard for people to hear when prayer requests are spoken from the congregation. It will be better when Bri shares prayer requests from the pulpit with a mic. It was also requested that Sunday's prayer requests go out early in the week on the prayer chain. Heather Emmons can do this.

Miscellaneous -- A larger sign has been put out front about not accepting donations of household items and clothes.

The next regular church council meeting will be Tuesday, September 21, 2021 at 7 pm.
